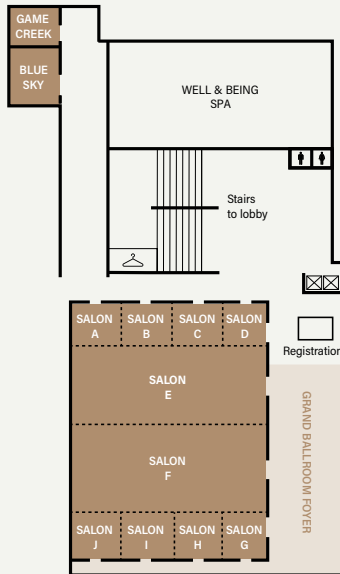

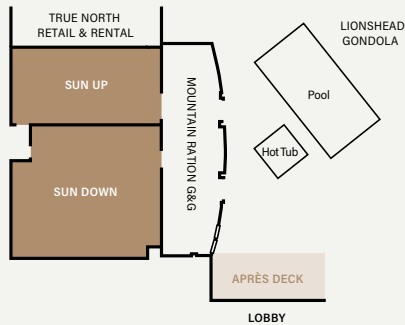

Admission

All registered participants and spouses are invited to attend the business sessions and social functions. *Due to limited space, the luncheons are limited to participants.* Registered children may attend the evening events (Saturday reception, Sunday reception, and Tuesday dinner event). Events cannot be sold separately and tickets are not transferable.

Location of Events

The Symposium events will be held as follows:

- **The Saturday reception** will be held on the Après Deck (weather permitting) and **the Sunday reception** will be held in the Grand Ballroom.
- **The Monday and Tuesday breakfasts and general sessions** will be held in the Grand Ballroom, located on the Conference level of the hotel. **The Monday and Tuesday luncheons** will be held in the Colorado Ballroom, located on the 2nd floor of the hotel.
- **The Tuesday evening dinner event** will be held off-site at 4 Eagle Ranch, and taking the ASA provided transportation is required.

Attire

The dress code for all business sessions will be resort casual, which includes long pants and golf shirts for men, and skirts, dress shorts or slacks and blouses for women. Vail's Rocky Mountain location translates to varying temperatures ranging from an average August high of 75 degrees and an average August low of 40 degrees. Throughout your stay, you will need a jacket for the cool mountain air in the mornings and evenings. A layering of clothing is recommended.

The base of Vail Valley sits at 8,150 ft above sea level. While Vail's Rocky Mountain location is what makes this area so lovely, it can also lead to altitude sickness. Please consider the following high altitude tips to promote an enjoyable Colorado experience. Drink lots of water to stay well-hydrated; moderate alcohol intake; and take it easy on the front end of your trip. And because you're closer to the sun, be sure to wear sunscreen, hat and glasses. GUIDED TOURS

Jeep Tour—Daily, 9:00AM & 2:00PM

Experience a sense of wilderness and the magnificent Rocky Mountains while traveling the countryside. Bring the Vail Valley up close and personal during your guided jeep tour as you enjoy spectacular vistas spanning miles of the Colorado high country. With more than 30 years of experience, Timberline Tours is the leading Vail jeep tour guide service. This tour begins with a pick-up at The Hythe Vail at either 9:00AM or 2:00PM. Your trained guide will help you pick the best tour available based on season and trail conditions, weather and group dynamics. These four-hour tours can accommodate 6 people per jeep, and two jeeps can be reserved together for larger groups. Prices are \$135 for adults (13+), \$115 for children (7-12), and \$65 (ages 6 & under) (exclusive of taxes/fees and gratuity). Prices include door-to-door transportation and a snack. Since you will be traveling in an open-air vehicle and traveling to higher altitudes, a warm jacket, a layering of clothes, sunscreen, and sunglasses are recommended. Zip Adventures—Daily, Times Vary

Zip Adventures offers the ultimate adrenaline rush while taking in the rugged beauty of Colorado. Located 20 miles northwest of Vail at the authentic 4 Eagle Ranch, Zip Adventures offers a unique course consisting of separate ziplines ranging from 150 to 1000 feet in length and 100 to 200 feet above the floor of Alkali Canyon. During your tour, you will experience pristine mountains, beautiful trees, raging rivers, jagged rock cliffs and the dramatic beauty of the canyon's floor while zipping up to 50 miles per hour over rugged canyon. A thorough safety briefing will be provided. Two trained guides accompany each trip to ensure maximum safety, as well as educate about the flora, fauna, and wildlife. Tours are offered at various times throughout the day, lasting approximately 2+ hours, and can accommodate large groups. Make sure to bring a hat, sunscreen, closed toe shoes or hiking boots, hair tie for shoulder length or longer hair, pants or shorts and jackets. Cameras with straps are welcome. Weight requirements: no minimum and a max of 250lbs. Not recommended for people with heart, back, hip or knee problems, or pregnant women. Must be able to hike ¾ mile on trails. Cost is \$180 per person and includes all safety gear, water and snacks. A minimum 15% gratuity is required for the guides. Transportation to Zip Adventures is on your own. Whitewater Rafting—Saturday & Sunday, AM and PM Trips

Experience the beauty and the exhilaration of the Colorado Rockies while rafting the Shoshone River. Timberline Tours has reserved both a morning and an afternoon trip specifically for Symposium participants. The Shoshone Morning Trip starts with pick-up at The Hythe Vail at 9:00AM for transport to Timberline's location, to be fitted with gear and receive an orientation. This trip typically offers white water, followed by

a relaxing float through the scenic Glenwood Canyon, for a total time on the river of 1.5–2 hours, followed by a luncheon. Return to the hotel is expected by 3:00PM. The Shoshone Afternoon Double Thriller Trip starts with pick up from The Hythe Vail at 2:00PM for transport to Timberline's HQ to be fitted with gear and receive an orientation. The Double Thriller Trip is ideally suited for those wanting white water only (no float) as it offers several laps on the same set of rapids, for a total time on the river of 1–1.5 hours. Return to the hotel is expected by 5:00PM. The trip includes door-to-door transportation, necessary equipment and snacks or lunch (varies by trip). Recommended attire includes bathing suits and sunscreen. Additionally, bring dry clothes if you would like to change at the take-out point. Fly Fishing, Daily—Times Vary

Outdoor enthusiasts will relish the opportunity to fish on more than 500 miles of pristine river through Colorado's Vail Valley. With access to the Eagle River, Gore Creek, Roaring Fork River, and the Colorado River, you can experience fly-fishing with the help and expertise of some of Vail's best anglers. Both beginners and experts are welcome. Trips can be tailored to your preference including wade trips, float trips, ½-day, ¾-day and full-day with varying prices. Note: Float trip availability is limited. SELF-GUIDED TOURS

Vail Farmers' Market and Art Show— Sunday, 9:30AM - 3:30PM

A highly popular summer activity is the Vail Farmers' Market and Art Show. Held on Sundays in the heart of Vail Village, this event includes over 148 tents, showcasing many made-in-Colorado artisan items and foods, as well as produce, 40 food vendors, music and more. Spend your Sunday enjoying the market, eating breakfast and/or lunch from the food vendors, and exploring Vail Village. The market is primarily held on Vail Village's East Meadow Drive, but also spreads to side streets throughout. Parking can be challenging so consider catching the free Vail Village in-town shuttle from the stop in front of The Hythe Vail to the Vail Transportation Center, for a quick 5-minute ride. Alternatively, you can walk from The Hythe Vail through Lionshead Village to Vail Village (20-minute walk). For more information, visit <http://www.vailfarmersmarket.com/>.

Bike the Pass—Daily, 10:00AM, 12:00PM & 2:00PM

This self-guided bike trip of the Vail Pass is a wonderful way to enjoy the Vail Valley, all at your own leisure. This adventure begins at Charter Sports, located in Lionshead Village just a short walk from The Hythe Vail, where you will be fitted with a mountain bike and provided a helmet. You will then be driven to the "top" of Vail Pass and provided with an orientation of the area. From there, you will start your scenic 18-mile downhill trek on a paved bike path. The first ten miles of your trip are primarily downhill on the bike path with no motorized traffic encountered until you drop into East Vail. At various points, you'll want to stop and enjoy the breathtaking views of the Gore Range and Vail Valley. As you continue into East Vail, you'll ride

by the Vail Golf Course, the Nature Center, the Ford Amphitheater, and the Betty Ford Alpine Gardens. For a true Vail experience, stop in Vail Village for an ice cream or lunch at an outdoor café. Return the bike to Charter Sports in Lionshead. Cost is \$70 per person (exclusive of taxes/fees and gratuity). Recommended attire includes shorts, tennis shoes, a warm jacket/layering of clothes, sunglasses, and sunscreen. The Hythe Vail's ideal location gives you quick access to a plethora of summer recreation.
