The agriculture and farming industry is crucial to the U.S. economy.

Ninety-four percent of voters say the agriculture and farming industry is important to the United States economy, including 77% who say the industry is *very important* to the United States economy.

After learning more about the American sugar industry, voters prefer purchasing American made sugar rather than imported sugar.

Additionally, 86% of voters say it is important for Congress to include provisions in the U.S. Farm Bill that adequately support the sugar industry. This is true across the political spectrum and among every geographic region.



Sugar Industry




Almost all (94%) voters say the agriculture and farming industry is important to the United States economy.

Thinking specifically about the agriculture and farming industry, how important, if at all, is the industry to the United States economy?




At least four-in-five voters agree that the agriculture and farming industry contributes to the U.S. economy (87%), sustains rural economies and communities (83%), provides adequate food supply for Americans (81%), and maintains high food safety and quality standards (81%).

Please indicate if you agree or disagree with the following when it comes to the agriculture and farming industry.




The overwhelming majority (75%) of voters say that global supply chain disruptions and COVID-19 had an impact on their food purchases – including 38% who said it had a *significant impact*.

Thinking specifically about the production and supply of food, what level of impact have global supply chain disruptions and COVID-19 had on your food purchases?




A majority (63%) of voters say that the domestic food supply should be less dependent on foreign suppliers – including 42% who say it should be definitely less dependent on foreign suppliers.

Based on what you know or have experienced, do you think domestic food supply should be more or less dependent on foreign suppliers?




Voters view farmers as trustworthy to safely handle crops (81%), sell crops at a fair price (79%), manage water responsibly (79%), produce crops sustainably (78%), follow environmental regulations (77%), and follow labor laws and protect worker safety (74%).

A majority of voters agree that food grown in the United States is safer (76%), has higher environmental and labor standards (76%), and is higher quality (74%).


Sugar Industry



SUGAR INDUSTRY

A majority of voters agree that sugar grown in the United States is higher quality (66%), produced with the world's highest labor standards (65%), and is produced sustainably (64%).


Based on what you know, please indicate if you agree or disagree that the following accurately describes sugar that is grown in the United States.



SUGAR INDUSTRY

A majority (64%) of voters prefer purchasing American sugar over imported sugar because it supports the American farmer and has been produced with the highest standards.

Foreign governments subsidize their sugar farmers and then dump excess supplies on to the world market, U.S. sugarcane and sugar beet farmers receive no direct payments from the U.S. government while adhering to labor, environmental and safety standards far beyond those of most foreign suppliers. Sugar grown by foreign suppliers is often produced with lower labor, environmental, or safety standards when compared to sugar growers here in the U.S. Many foreign sugar suppliers also enjoy subsidies, which allow them to sell sugar at lower prices. After learning more, which of the following statements best describes your opinion of purchasing sugar imported from foreign sources?



SUGAR POLICY AND U.S. FARM BILL

Seventy-one percent of voters support government involvement with sugar policy, because it keeps sugar affordable and ensures a reliable supply, as well as protects farmers.

Next you will read two statements about provisions in the U.S. Farm Bill that support the sugar industry. Please indicate which statement you agree with more, even if neither is exactly right.




- Current sugar policy keeps sugar affordable and makes sure American consumers have a reliable supply. It provides American farmers with a safety net – just as we provide for all farmers. It prevents foreign countries from dumping subsidized sugar and displacing American farmers and workers. It operates at no cost to the American taxpayer.
- Government interference in the sugar market hurts consumers and food manufacturers by driving up the price of sugar and preventing them from getting more foreign sugar cheaper. These food manufacturers say the price of sugar due to sugar policy is forcing them to relocate overseas.

SUGAR POLICY AND U.S. FARM BILL

A strong majority of (77%) voters say it should at least be an important priority for Congress to reauthorize the U.S. Farm Bill, including 43% who say it should be a *top priority*.

Later this year, Congress will review and reauthorize the U.S. Farm Bill. The U.S. Farm Bill is a set of policies that provides assistance for growing food, fiber, and fuel; feeding people; and caring for our environment.
