


The White House

Kamala Harris: Key opportunities







- 1. Dem jolt of money/enthusiasm: \$81 million raised in 24 hours, base Dem voters feel they're "back in the game"
- 2. Ability to redefine race: Unlike Biden, can forcefully try to put spotlight back on Trump and "Project 2025"
- **3. Age/generational contrast:** Now *Trump* asking to be oldest POTUS ever
- 4. Potential for VP pick who could moderate her image: Beshear, Shapiro, Cooper, Kelly...Walz?

Kamala Harris: Key liabilities







VOTE

- 1. Border "Czar:" even six House Dems voted to condemn her handling of migrant crisis & border portfolio as VP
- 2. Coastal/SF & to Biden's left: in 2020, supported ending cash bail, fracking ban, decriminalizing border crossings
- 3. Tendency to "word salad:" At times, so risk averse she ends up saying nothing "Let's have that conversation"
- 4. Ramping up campaign & message: History of high staff turnover, few new ambitious policy goals to excite voters

Demographic Erosion: will Harris gain back lost ground?









Also keep in mind: Biden/Harris have had the airwaves to themselves all year. That's about to end.




Presidential Spending in Swing States:










2024 Electoral Math: Will Harris have a more plausible path to victory?










Keep in mind...

Harris's path of least resistance may be more evenly distributed between the **Sun Belt** and **Rust Belt** states than Biden's was

Third party candidates could lower **threshold for victory** to 45%-46% of the popular vote







House Republicans: New speaker, same math problems





Irony: McCarthy's recruits won Republicans the majority in 2022. Now, he's on a vengeance tour.





Re-redistricting: changes benefitting Dems in Alabama, New York and (maybe) Louisiana mostly offset pro-GOP changes in North Carolina





The Fight for Congress: High stakes for agriculture





Farm Bill 2024 political dynamics:

- Current extension expires Sept. 30th and CBO estimates 2024
 Farm Bill will total \$1.51 trillion, up from \$867 billion in 2018
- Both parties agree on need to update reference prices, modernize H-2A visa program & strengthen crop insurance
- Republicans pushing to reallocate Inflation Reduction Act climate funding to non-climate Farm Bill conservation titles
- Democrats insistent on maintaining current levels of Climate & Nutrition funding & adding Specialty Crop Insurance subtitle
- Freedom Caucus Republicans pushing to shrink SNAP, deny states ability to block work requirements for Food Stamps

Both parties holding out for full control of Congress in 2025, but could a deal be cut in the "lame duck" session?
